Other Site Characteristics

The area comprises a set of ponds of the Syalets Fish Farm (about 2,500 ha), the Syalets Reservoir (about 2,000 ha), which are located near (to the south of) the Ruzhany Puscha forest, as well as the southern, waterlogged, part of that forest. There are two small rivers with waterlogged floodplains, the Khotova and Radogosch, within that forest. The ponds are set in a compact group to the south of the forest. Some ponds are heavily overgrown with emergent macrophytes (reed, cattail, club rush). A wide band in the reservoir shoreline is occupied by well-developed stands of emergent macrophytes (cattail, reed, club rush). Alder and birch, as well as dry pine wood prevail in the forest. There are sections of open mesotrophic swamps in forests and river valleys.

4.2 Quality and importance

The fish farm ponds provide a major breeding ground for a number of waterfowls: the common pochard, *aythya ferina* (up to 5% of the national population); the gadwall, *anas strepera* (more than 2% of the national population); the Eurasian bittern, *botaurus stellaris*; and the white-tailed eagle, *haliaeetus albicilla* (more than 2% of the national population), up to 10% of the national population of the great white egret, *casmerodius albus*; about 1% of the national population of the little bittern, *ixobrychus minutus*; the common crane, *grus grus*; the Eurasian eagle-owl, *bubo bubo*. More than 20,000 waders accumulate at the area water bodies during the migration season.
